

Paying Delinquent Property Taxes Online

Step 1: Visit www.co.midland.mi.us/treasurer. You can also find this page by searching “Midland County MI.” The Treasurer’s page can be found under “Government.”

The Office of the County Treasurer was established by the Michigan State Constitution. The Treasurer is an elected official and serves a 4-year term. The majority of the Treasurer's duties are set by statute, however authority is also provided for by the County Board of Commissioners and needs of our community. The Treasurer is the custodian of all County funds, and is responsible for receipting, recording and investing all money received by the various departments within the County. As Investment Officer for the County, the Treasurer is responsible for the safeguarding and investing of these monies, acting in accordance with the County's Investment policy.

The Midland County Treasurer is also responsible for ensuring adequate cash flow, the collection of delinquent real property taxes, settling with the Townships and Cities for their uncollected real property taxes, selling dog licenses and maintaining accurate records, auditing of Principal Residence Exemptions, collecting of delinquent personal property taxes for most townships, conducting the annual property tax forfeiture/foreclosure process and auction, certification of deeds, plats and tax histories, among other duties.

The County Treasurer is a member of the Plat Board, the County Elections Commission, the County Apportionment Commission, the ACT 345 Retirement Board, Retiree Health Care Plan, and other commissions and agencies as appointed, mandated or by volunteer.

Instructions for Use of the Tax Database:

A screen will come up with a menu choice on the left side. You can search by parcel code or owner name for all townships, the City of Coleman and the Village of Sanford.

To search for a parcel in City of Midland you must type in 180 then the city parcel code and two zeros at the end. The City of Midland does have it's own website that is updated in real-time. To view the City of Midland website please go to:


Example: Code 14-01-23-456 is typed as 18014012345600

Once the parcel code comes up on the screen, click on the code and it will show you general information about the parcel.

Step 3: The “Search Public Records” button will bring you to BS&A Online. Search the database by street number, name or parcel number.



Step 4: Once you select your address, you can toggle between the “tax information” and “Delinquent Tax Information” tabs. Tax information has information pertaining to current taxes. Delinquent tax information has information pertaining to late taxes.
